Core Curriculum Drivers

We know that our children will enter a diverse and challenging world of work where they are going to need to demonstrate a unique set of life skills and be prepared for lifelong learning. Our curriculum is designed to help them to achieve this.

PE Days



On PE days children come to school in their active uniform (their PE kit).

Class emails

- These are not checked during the school day as we are in class teaching your children. Any emails about sickness or pick ups must go to the office, they will pass the information onto us in the classroom.
- Every Friday we will send you an email about what we have been learning and what to expect the following week.
- Please check that we have the correct email address for you on the list to ensure you receive all important information.

Reading books...



Children will change books on Mondays and Thursdays

Please ensure the reading record is in their bags every day as we may read with them on additional days in school.

They will have two books:

1 – A fluency book. This is a banded phonetically decodable book where they should be able to read 90% fluently – without having to sound out all the words. Read and RE-READ this book.

2 – A sharing book. This is a story or information book from the class library to share together with your child.

3- Library book (optional). This is where children are able to visit our school library once a week and pick a book of their choice. Library books are borrowed with their personal library accounts.

Reading should be ENJOYED; it should not be a chore!

Read and share any other books at home alongside these.

Record reading with comments in their reading record.

Home Learning



We will be sending home in the next week a login for Spelling Shed and Maths Shed. (One login means you can access both of these).

Children will be tested on set spellings every Friday.

We will set some maths activities linked to the areas of maths learning. This is a mixture of activities and games.

‘Take away’ Home learning – this will be a grid with a range of different activities your child can try at home linked to the learning each term. This will be available on the website. Please either email or send in any home learning so we can celebrate it in school.

Healthy School



- Remember we are a healthy school.
- This means that we ask the children to access WATER during the day, not juice/squash.
- Snacks are to be a piece of fruit/vegetables
- We are a NUT FREE school, with some severe allergies, please do not give your child any nut products in their lunches.

This includes Nutella and Peanut Butter!

Birthdays

- We are unable to accept sweets/cakes etc for the children for birthdays or other occasions. If you wish to provide something for the class to enjoy, a wet play game or story book is very appreciated.
- We do not hand out party invitations at school, this will need to be organised outside of school.



Medicines

- Please ensure that your child's medication is in school and within date.
- We must have the completed care plan otherwise we are unable to administer any medicine.
- Do not place medicine or creams in your child's bag – please give them to a member of staff.
- If your child has been in hospital, please make one of us aware, as we may need to make a short term care plan to ensure we are able to care for them effectively.

Attendance

- We expect all children to attend school every day. Please make every effort to ensure your child attends on time every day.
- The doors to the Year 5 area open at 8:45 and close at 9:00 prompt, if you arrive after this time your child will need to enter via the front gate and office. We submit the register at 9:05am to allow children to walk around and be in class on time.
- If your child has sickness or diarrhoea due to a bug please keep them off for 48 hours after the last bout.
