Include reasons for or against.</p>	<p>Maths: Make a shopping list of things you would like to eat in a day. Find the prices of the items and then total the cost. How much have you spent all week? How could you save money?</p>	<p>ENGLISH: Write a letter to someone who inspires you explaining to them WHY they inspire you. (It could be someone you know in your family or friends; or it could be someone famous such as an author, a sports person etc) Think about how formal you will be when writing it.</p>	<p>PSHE: Create an informational leaflet including different clubs and activities in the local area for children your age.</p>

Can you write down how their beliefs are different?</p>	<p>Maths: Create a time table of events using o'clock, half past, quarter past or quarter- to times.</p>	<p>English: Describe a setting of your choice using adjectives, adverbs, prepositions and conjunctions. You can also include a picture of your setting.</p>	<p>Maths: Write about the different ways to pay and why it might be important to earn money.</p>
<p>English: Write a paragraph using as many examples of apostrophes as you can.</p>	<p>Art: Drawing Create a textured drawing of a fox, to link with our English topic of Fantastic Mr. Fox. Aim to use textures to show the facial features and fur of the fox</p>	<p>Maths: Write your own maths problem to do with money. Make sure you also provide the answers!</p>	<p>Science: Sound Construct an instrument that can play a variety of sounds. You might include a drum, or even strings as part of your instrument.</p>
