Introducing: The Mental Health Support Team (MHST) or MYME as we are known locally (My young minds Enfield)

The Mental Health Support Team/ MYME has been commissioned to work in educational settings across Enfield to support children/young people/parent and carers with their emotional wellbeing. Your child's educational setting is supported by trained Mental Health Practitioners, working in collaboration with school staff. We aim to help all children and young people to succeed and achieve their full potential by providing a range of services, including:

- Group Work
- Workshops
- One-to-one sessions
- Drop-in sessions
- Supporting 'peer mentoring' programmes,
- Signposting children with higher needs to access the right support,
- Offering training and consultation to school staff,
- Building on schools' current wellbeing provision.
- Whole school approach
- Assembly's

Interventions offered by MYME are evidence based and tailored to the individual needs of each setting. We use Cognitive Behavioural Therapy (CBT) strategies and Guided Self Help for mild to moderate mental health to support children and young people. One-to-one referrals are made to MHST by educational settings.
